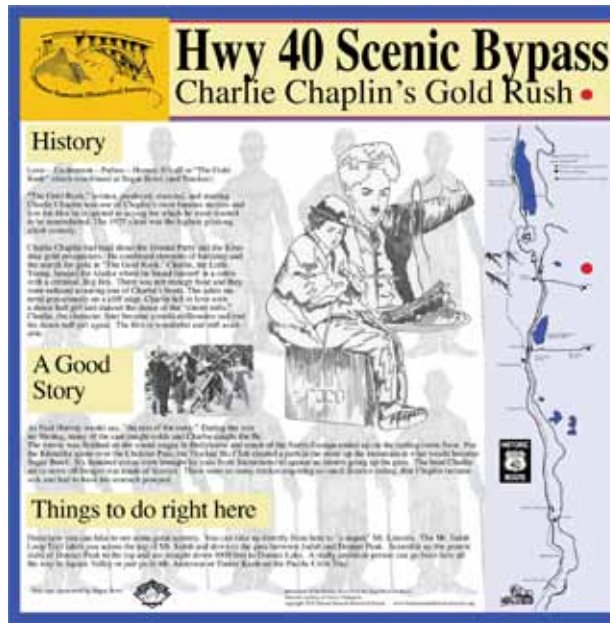

Building Tunnel 6 Today

Boring machines are used to bore tunnels. A circular boring machine can bore a tunnel 20' in diameter at a rate of about 50 feet a day. Making Tunnel 6 today would take about a month, rather than the two years it took in 1866-67.



20 Mile Museum

Visit the Donner Summit Historical Society's 20 Mile Museum with interpretive signs from Nyack on I-80 at Emigrant Gap to below Rainbow Bridge on Donner Summit's Old Highway 40.

Like the example above, each sign tells the history of the spot, a good story, and activities to do right there.
