Then there are the lesser stories: ice industry, lumbering, tourism to Lake Tahoe, first bicyclist across the Sierra (across the country and around the world), first motorized crossing of the Sierra, first automobile crossing of the Sierra, the coming of winter sports (tobogganing, ski jumping, slalom, the ice palace), etc.

Artwork for the Sesquicentennial should be related to the impact of the railroad to Truckee and the Donner Summit area or related to events stemming from the coming of the railroad.

Art work can tell a story or simply depict aspects of the above.
